## How to Book

### Subscription Tickets

A subscription entitles the holder to attend all four concerts for the price of three and thereby to become a member of South Holland Concerts for the current season.

Members of South Holland Concerts are eligible to vote at the Annual General Meeting. Using the Booking Form overleaf, subscriptions can be obtained from the Treasurer in advance or on the evening of the first concert.

### Individual Tickets

Tickets for individual concerts (£11.00 adults; £10.00 concessions) are available in advance from the box office at the South Holland Centre, where they may also be available on the night of the concert.

### Patrons' Tickets

As well as enjoying the normal advantages of Membership, Patrons receive reserved seats in the best part of the hall and an acknowledgement in the concert programme. Patrons' tickets are transferable.

### Students

All children and students in full-time education are admitted to our concerts free of charge.

### Wheelchair access

Access throughout the South Holland Centre is available to wheelchair users. The auditorium has special spaces provided for wheelchairs. The Box Office will be happy to help you. We would kindly ask you to inform them that you require a space in advance of the concert.
