Martinu String Quartet with Angus Meryon (clarinet)

This is your opportunity to hear a live performance of the two best-loved clarinet quintets in the repertoire, those by Mozart and Brahms. They will be played by a long-established Czech quartet, renowned as much for the empathy between its members as for the virtuosity and warm musicality of its playing, with Angus Meryon, well-known for his solo clarinet and chamber music recitals. Separating these masterpieces will be Dvořák's beautiful American string quartet.

Subscription Tickets

Individual Tickets
